OUTSOURCED BIO MEDICAL WASTE MANAGEMENT SERVICES

The Medical Superintendent, on behalf of Director, AIIMS Bhopal, invites "Expression of Interest" from the interested firms for "Providing Bio-Medical Waste Management" outsourced service to AIIMS Bhopal as detailed under:-

Expression of Interest is invited from **authorized from MPPCB (Madhya Pradesh Pollution Control Board) for collection, transport treatment and disposal of Bio-Medical Waste in the district of Bhopal.**

Eligible firms may apply by furnishing detailed information as outlined in the procedure of application given below.

The completed application may be submitted in the office of Medical Superintendent, AIIMS Bhopal Hospital, Saket Nagar, Bhopal-462020(MP) by 18.10.2016 till 5 PM by the Interested Eligible Agencies.

AIIMS Bhopal intends to out-source services related to the collection, transport, treatment and disposal of Bio-medical waste and thereby invites “Expression of Interest” from firms having valid authorization from Madhya Pradesh Pollution Control Board (MPPCB) to operate in Bhopal district. The present call for EOI is for engaging eligible Bio Medical Waste Management Service Provider Agency for a period of **2 years**, from the date of Notification of Award of Work.

SCOPE OF WORK:

1. The contractor should have valid authorization from Madhya Pradesh Pollution Control authorities to carry out the handling, reception, storage, transport, treatment and disposal of Bio-medical waste in Bhopal, throughout the period of contract.
2. The selected firm shall be responsible for the handling, reception, transport and disposal of biomedical waste from the hospital and medical college associated with AIIMS Bhopal. It shall be the legal duty of the firm to ensure that biomedical waste is collected, transported and disposed in such a manner that they do not cause any adverse impact on human health or environment, **as per the provision of Bio-Medical Waste (Management & Handling) Rule 2016.**
3. General waste (i.e. all non- hazardous waste materials such as paper, cardboard, plastic, food items and office trash) should not be mixed with bio- medical waste and vice- versa.
4. Sites where the different categories of bio-medical waste is generated would include, but may not necessarily be limited to, all patient- care activity areas, diagnostic service areas, operation theatre areas, labour rooms, ICUs, procedure rooms, wards, nurseries, treatment rooms and practical laboratories & research laboratories in hospital and medical college buildings. The departments of Anatomy, Physiology, Biochemistry, Pathology, Microbiology, Pharmacology, Community & Family Medicine, and Forensic Medicine & Toxicology are located in the Medical College building and are to be covered under this service.
5. The contractor shall collect the segregated bags of waste from the pre-determined collection points (2-3 Bio- Medical Waste storage rooms decided by the 1st party) at pre-determined time (during hospital hours) in special vehicle approved by MP Pollution Control Board (PCB). The Contractor will accept & collect the segregated waste, only in the approved colour-coded non-chlorinated plastic bags. The segregated bags collected from the Bio- Medical Waste storage rooms shall be weighed by the representative of the contractor in presence of authorized hospital representative. Representative of the contractor shall sign the ‘Daily Collection Sheet’ in token of acknowledgement of quantity of waste received.
6. All legal responsibility of Bio-Medical Waste treatment shall be of the operator immediately after it being picked up from the storage rooms.
7. If any mishap happens during transportation all responsibility shall be that of the contractor.
8. Irrespective of shut down/break down of the plant/incinerator/CTF, it will be the responsibility of the contractor to collect Bio-Medical Waste from all Bio- Medical Waste storage rooms every day.

9. The contractor shall be responsible for any punitive legal action arising out of non- lifting / non-collection and non- disposal of Bio-Medical Waste form AIIMS Bhopal.
10. In case of breakdown, if disposal is not done within 48 hrs (as per rules & regulations of Bio-Medical Waste Management & Handling) Rule 1998, all legal responsibility shall be that of the contractor.
11. Collection of Bio-Medical Waste will be undertaken daily. In case of default **no payment** shall be made for that particular day/ days. There would be an additional penalty amounting to 1% of the monthly payment if Bio-medical waste is not picked up from AIIMS Bhopal for duration of 48- 72 hours and 2% of the monthly payment for every additional day of failure to pick up.
12. All biomedical waste must be treated or disposed of **within 48 hours** of it being generated.
13. The firm shall transport the bio-medical waste in a dedicated covered vehicle to an authorized waste treatment facility as per rules and time to time instructions issued from the MPPCB. .
14. It would be the inescapable duty of the firm to ensure that the instruments and practices used for the treatment and disposal of the waste comply with the standards prescribed in Bio-medical Waste (Management & Handling) Rules, 2016. AIIMS Bhopal would be free to inspect the site and check documentary evidence to that effect from time to time.
15. The firm would be required to assist AIIMS Bhopal in filling annual reports and other reports/ records as mandated by the appropriate pollution control authorities from time to time.
16. The contractor shall be open for inspection of its waste treatment and disposal facilities by a designated team of AIIMS Bhopal, in order to ascertain its compliance with the provisions mentioned in Bio-Medical Waste (Management and Handling) Rules, 1998.

- A. Introduction of firm, including year of establishment; legal registration status; nature of ownership; areas of work; contact details of top management and office and CBWTF premises
- B. Details of authorization from MPPCB, with all supporting document
- C. Capacity Details of : Incinerator, Autoclave, Shredder, Microwave etc. (include whichever is available)
- D. Existing list of institutions served with their respective bed strength.
